### **Randall Craig Fleischer**

Conductor–Symphony POPS! Concert, October 8, 2005

After completing his tenure as associate conductor of the National Symphony Orchestra of Washington, D.C., Randall Craig Fleischer is currently music director of the Hudson Valley Philharmonic and the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra. He is also artistic director/principal conductor of the Flagstaff Symphony Orchestra.

### **Mark Mandarano**

Conductor–Holiday Celebration Concert, December 10 & 11, 2005

Mark Mandarano returns by popular demand to conduct the Long Beach Symphony Orchestra's Holiday Celebration concert. He is the principal guest conductor of the Moscow Chamber Orchestra, and recently completed a four-year tenure as associate conductor at the Pacific Symphony Orchestra.

### **Richard Kaufman**

Conductor–Symphony POPS! Concert, January 28, 2006

Richard Kaufman is the principal pops conductor of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and the Pacific Symphony Orchestra. He has devoted much of his life to conducting and supervising music for film and television productions, as well as performing film and classical music in concert halls and on recordings.

### **Timothy Muffitt**

Now in his sixth season as music director and conductor of the Baton Rouge Symphony, Timothy Muffitt continues to appear with other prominent orchestras around the country, including the San Francisco, Houston and Phoenix symphonies.
